Financial Reports for 2020-2021 & 2021-2022 Budget

Presented by Evan: Approximately \$15,000 in expenses over income.

- 1. \$8000 extra mortgage payment,
- 2. Photocopier—bought out contract \$6000,
- 3. Missions Trip money repaid to those who would not be participating. Discussion followed.

2021-2022 Budget

- Income needed is \$175,956.83
- Westchester is to contribute 20% of their income.
- expected \$10,000 bill for bathroom & plumbing
- Pastor & full-time assistant pastor salaries
- No photocopier contract
- Website costs lower & should continue to decrease as web provider is new
- Ministries take a reduction in light of the new full-time staff position and the growth possible with this new position
- \$176,000 (approximate) budget will need the commitment of the people and lead AWC in the right direction.
- Discussion included:
 - Worship costs includes equipment needed
 - Payroll deductions for assistant pastor: Michael was paid and he rented his own housing-Brad will receive housing (BRH) as part of his re-numeration
 - Ministry Honorariums were cut back because giving did not match the amount voted for in a previous budget
 - Loose offering is counted as regular giving and added to the operating account.
- Members voted to accept the budget as presented.

- 1. Big Red House received a little touch-up; some painting, lots of new flooring, updated shower (thank you to those who put in the hard work of completing those projects on short notice, and those who gave sacrificially to cover the cost!)
- 2. Converted the second bathroom in the Big Red House to a closet and got a working vent in the main bathroom.

COMMUNITY CARE

Community Care exists to: love others in down to earth ways; meeting practical, emotional & spiritual needs.

Accomplishments

Three Stephen Ministers continued to walk alongside hurting people

- Four more people are being trained as well to be Stephen Ministers and a Stephen Leader.
- The Frozen Meals Ministry Team made 34 meals for people in crisis/need.
- This year a total of 31 sets of Grief booklets were sent to grieving individuals (13 of those were receiving them prior to the beginning of the 2021/22 ministry year).
- 4 Teen Grief Kits and 5 Children's Grief Kits have been distributed.
- 2 Grieving Hearts Peer Support Groups were held and work has begun. The peer support grief group for families (parents, teens and children) is still in the works.
- Christmas is the Worst had 2 attendees and 15 additional bereaved individuals received support materials.
- We provided funeral reception support for 2 families.
- Celebrate Recovery is still operating
- Benevolent Food Cupboard was paused during COVID and we are praying and thinking about its return. (This is a small pantry of food purchased when items are on sale to meet crisis needs when the foodbank is not open.)
- Connections with individuals and community agencies are increasing again after another COVID decline.
- We continued to support After the Bell School program with food donations.

Goals & Plans

- Increased connections with community agencies and schools
- Finish Preparing the Family Grief Group Materials and Training Facilitators for Grieving Hearts Peer Support Groups
- Expand the reach of Children & Teen Grief Toolkits to Cumberland County Schools

Prayer Requests

- Celebrate Recovery: Increased awareness, changed lives and training new leaders
- Bereavement Family Support Group & Selection and training of facilitators for all groups.
- What God wants us to do next!

- Create Hangout Space in Basement
- Build connections with the community (schools, youth development center, etc.)

When I began my time at AWC as the incoming Assistant Pastor I came with excitement to begin serving as the department head for youth ministry. Our Fall launch was successful and we gained great momentum throughout the Fall. Our teens sacrificed their Halloween evening to collect candy to instead collect non-perishables for our local food bank. That was our last evening together in person until March 2022 as everything was brought to a screeching halt by the reintroduction of restrictions. We maintained things by meeting over zoom during the winter months but lost our momentum and relationships were no longer being fostered as strongly. While I personally wrestled with many mixed emotions during these straining and uncertain months, I thank God for bringing us through and allowing us to begin meeting in person again. We started by first meeting in homes (first at the York's home then my apartment) before returning to the church. I felt this was the best way to repair relationships and reignite the spark that was lost. I look forward to the coming year with greater excitement and hopefulness feeling confident we will have a year free of interference from covid restrictions and that our youth ministry will grow.

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Pastor's Report

Rev. Evan Oxner

Year Seven

Let me get some of the nasty stuff out of the way right at the start. The ongoing pandemic, restrictions, division, fear and proof of vaccination policy really were terrible. I hated the idea of turning people away. I sat in Sheryl's office during one service and cried because I knew the rules we needed to follow were going to push some people away. Doing everything we could to accommodate everyone and not jeopardize our doors being open due to fines or massive bad press was incredibly confusing and stressful. It felt like every time we picked up momentum, we got slapped back to a stall. We didn't see a lot of fighting in our church, but the diverse and intense opinions that were fostered through the media and our government always held our unity on the edge of a cliff.

Yet, we survived. We're still here. And I think God has set us up to do incredible things. As hard as the pandemic has been, it actually feels like we weren't trying to push a rock up a hill, we were trying to get it over the crest of the hill. Momentum wants to happen. The pandemic just kept us from going over that crest. I think right now it might actually be harder to stop what God is doing here than to get it going again!

What do I mean by all that? Our expenses were higher than expected, and higher than our income last year, but we brought in more than we expected too. We took a step of faith and hired Pastor Brad fulltime, during the pandemic, and God provided! We needed to do renovations to their apartment, and the costs were covered. We thought we needed to replace the roof this year, and it looks like we actually have 4-5 years to save up for that. Our mortgage is barely over \$50 000 now. Brad is building the youth ministry almost from the ground up, Sheryl is actively training more leaders and Stephen Ministers, and our attendance lately has been very close to what it was pre-pandemic.

We recruited a group of mentors and apprentices to see at least 20 people grow in their leadership capacity, confidence and skills, and they are blowing me away. My men's small group, even though they complained constantly about the idea of it, each developed their own lesson and led that lesson during our small group time. AND THESE GUYS DID MASSIVELY INCREDIBLE JOBS! Every one of them nailed it! Pastor Linda had to step back from leading small group, so Linda Borne took over, and I have seen God stir inside her a confidence I have never seen in her before! Our ministry department leaders are blowing me away too!

Our ministry leaders are getting better and better and better at recruiting, investing, casting vision, delegating, putting on effective and creative ministries and the synergy between them in our meetings is electric! To sit in the room with all of our ministry leaders you can immediately sense their unity, focus, and drive to advance the kingdom of God. This is a unity and energy I have been dreaming about for the past 7 years!



In March I was asked if I would leave AWC to pastor a different church. Obviously, I decided to stay here. Heidi and I made that decision because we didn't feel we were done here, there is something more to do. For 7 years we have worked to develop leaders and to get ministry into your hands. We have worked to create purpose and alignment around why we exist. We have worked to create a reputation as a place people can come and feel like they belong. We have made great progress with these things, but there is something more we need to face.

For 7 years we have felt a deep spiritual opposition to the work that is happening here. God has obviously blessed and confirmed the direction this church is taking, but the enemy is fighting hard to keep this town and this community in his control. I believe we need to break through that wall. We need to tear down the wall the enemy has built and has been guarding so fiercely. We need to reach the people who are lost here.

I need to step up my game, I need to become a better pastor, a better leader, a better speaker, a better dad, a better husband, a better man. We as a church need to step up our game, and we need to be pushed. We have done the bulk of the work needed to get us to the place of health, but now it is time to push ourselves to be athletes that win the race.

There is a passage in Jeremiah chapter 12 where God speaks to the prophet after he has just complained to God about something. God's response to Jeremiah is basically, "how do you expect to race against horses when you can't even keep up with other men?" Paul echoes a similar challenge in 1 Corinthians 9. We are in a race. We are in a war. It is a war for the souls of our families, our neighbours, our community. We're not going to win it haphazardly. We're not going to win it by accident. We're not going to win by holding onto sin, our comfort, or our fears. God has what we need to get better and better. He wants to give it to us, to change us, to fill us with His purpose, His power, His authority, His claim to this area. But it means giving up our way for His, our dreams for His, our ideas for His.

Our budget is big. The number of lost souls in our area of mission is massive. The stronghold of the enemy on this area through pride, drugs, sexual promiscuity, desperation, confusion and greed is like iron. We need to run faster, fight harder, last longer, and dig deeper to race against these horses. Giving, serving, sacrificing, confessing, submitting, repenting, praying, and being boldly obedient without hesitation. It's through the power and victory of Jesus that we will win this, if we are willing to follow Him there.
