- Meals Ministry gave out many meals this year to support people in crisis. However, now there is a bit of a change with Souls Harbour coming to serve our community even more people are able to benefit with their hot lunches.
- ESL started last April and we have seen it flourish under the leadership of Olivia Jordan, with up to 10 attendees.
- Sharon Taylor lead a team of volunteers from AWC at the food bank up till January showing God's love and kindness to the less fortunate in our community.
- Annette O'Keefe continues to provide excellent leadership with Christmas is the Worst providing support to individuals during difficult times in their lives.
- The Christmas Wrap-Up and bake auction was a great success this year. We continued all our normal activities for this event and provided a Christmas Dinner for over 20 people at the homeless Hub.
- Last June at the Big Give we saw several hundred people come through our doors. They were excited to receive free items and have a pancake brunch. Emerson packing joined with us for this event and some of their employees came to help out with face painting, helping in the kitchen, and helping load peoples vehicles, they were blown away by the generosity of the event.

Accomplishments

- Had 53 students on one night had to dye my hair pink
- Launched new program/curriculum for grades 6-7 (Loop); proving effective
- Participated in Town Christmas parade, won best charity award
- Expanded our social media presence creating community amongst teens
- Created newsletter for parents, better communication
- Our grade 8 girls group is launching their own separate bible study with their leader outside of youth nights
- Handed out several Bibles to new students
- Started a new mentorship program
- Celebrated 1 baptism
- Created a new "Code of Conduct" for students to follow while at EDGE Youth
- Did our first fundraiser and brought in ~\$2500
- 113 Teens at Rally for Impact

Challenges

- New leaders finding their confidence
- Growing number of students has made "gametime" difficult. When many teens show up we start to feel cramped in our space
- Disruptive students during worship/small groups

Goals and Plans

- Considering a second night geared for younger students
- Greater engagement with mentorship...see teens "want" these rather than Pastor Brad just present them as good ideas...have students take greater initiative towards our mission
- have a single night of over 60 students

This past year we saw the most growth ever, potentially in AWC's history. With a record high of 53 students on a single night; which led to Pastor Brad dyeing his hair pink, and an average attendance of ~30 students, EDGE Youth continued to take ground and help teens follow Jesus. Not only did we see numerical growth but we saw amazing spiritual growth in many teens. God is clearly doing a work but the work isn't done. Back in February, the Lord made it clear that a deep work is what's next. We've spent the last 4 years building a reputable program and drawing teens together but need to take their faith in a deeper direction. We hear reports of teens struggling to defend their faith, understand their faith, and share their faith; all key fundamental principles for believers. The battles teens face in their day-to-day lives are difficult and with the right tools and relationships, our teens are going to be used by God in ways to transform our community. - Bradford Jordan

Pastor's Report

Rev. Evan Oxner

Year Ten

Well, where do I even start with this past year? We started the year with changes coming, having to say goodbye to Sheryl and Dwayne, then Pastor Brad bought a house and we started on the renovations of the apartment. Then there was the boiler. Then there was the electrical. Then I became the chaplain for the Amherst Police Department. Then the chairlift died. Then our finances plummeted while our heating bill went up and we almost had to lay off Pastor Brad. Financially and with the building it has been a lot.

There was The Big Give, the biggest we have ever done. We held our Konnect Camp, Trunk or Treat, Christmas Wrap-up, Christmas Eve, Easter celebrations and our Baptism events! Actually, we had an extra baptism this year because someone unexpected wanted to take that step of faith!

We officially started partnering with Souls Harbour, received a grant for the chairlift replacement, and after a hard message on giving saw our finances jump back to life! I had felt like I needed to take a step of obedience by preaching that message, even though I really didn't want to. I felt the obedience was more important than the risk, and even if the money didn't change, I knew the path forward is only forged by obedience to our God. I feel like I actually held our church back by not preaching that message sooner.

I have been slowly working my way through meeting with the families in our church. I don't have everyone schedule in, and finding a time when families are free can be a real challenge, but the conversations I have had have been so good and so refreshing. If I haven't met with your family yet, please reach out to me so we can set up a time.

Celebrate Recovery became Overcomers, Overcomers became The Olive Branch, and now The Olive Branch has withered. We tried to host our grief ministries and they never got traction.

Our people have been phenomenal though! You have served this year with incredible sacrifice, passion and excellence. You have taken steps of faith and have worked to share Jesus through your life with those around you. People have been reached and changed because of your faithfulness and obedience. Our community continues to see this church as a place of life and are amazed by what is happening here. In spite of all the problems we have faced and all the weird changes we have attempted to navigate over this past year, our attendance has grown, our teen ministry has grown and our kids ministry is starting to feel the restrictions of physical space! That's not my doing; that's the Holy Spirit working in you!
